

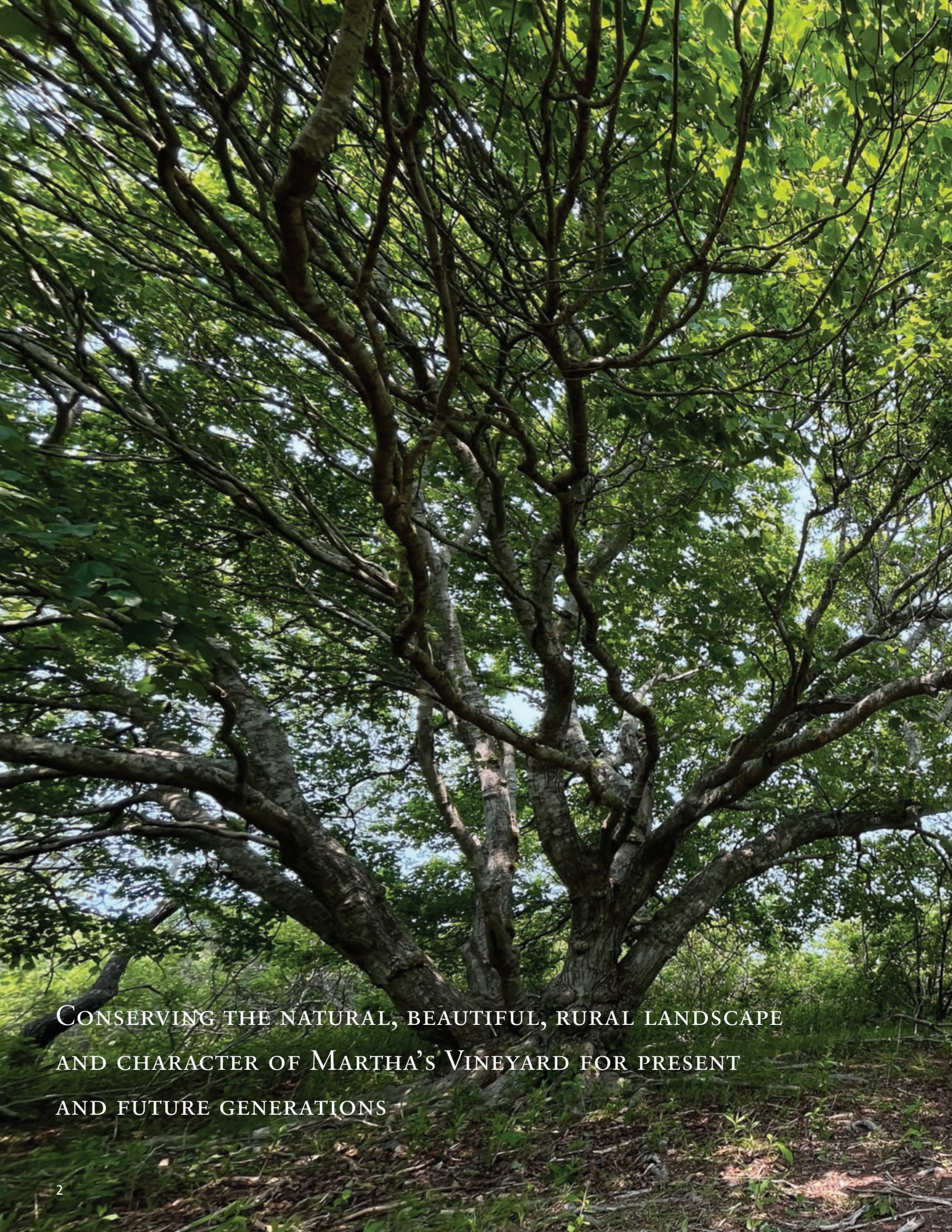

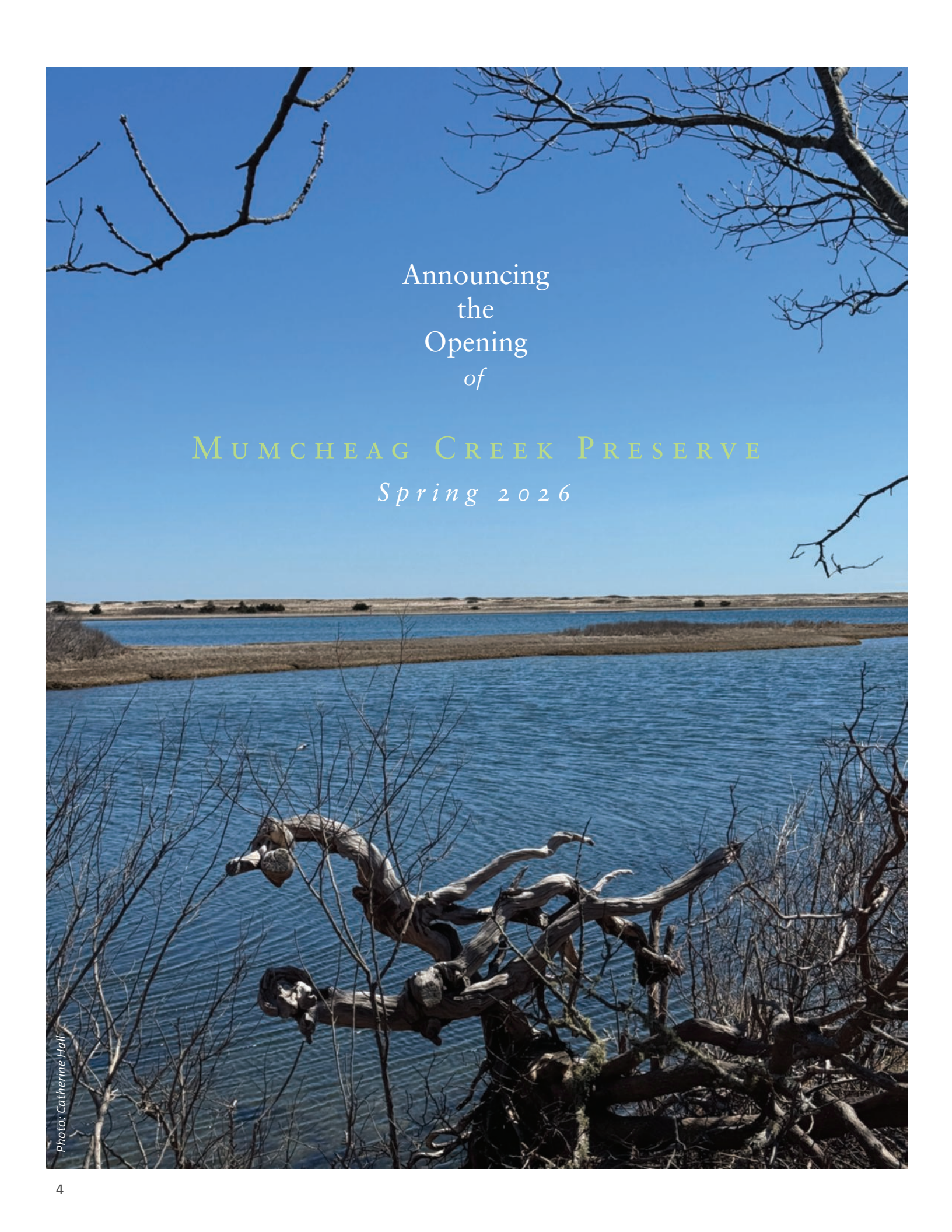

Report of the Board Chair, *Susannah Bristol*

Our Annual Report is one way to thank you, the many, many supporters of Sheriff's Meadow Foundation, for ensuring that our work of conservation flourishes. Since its modest beginnings in 1958, Sheriff's Meadow has grown from its first namesake sanctuary to 80 preserves and 45 conservation restrictions, covering all corners of Martha's Vineyard and Chappaquiddick – about 3,500 acres in all.

Contributors to Sheriff's Meadow, listed at length in this report, help fund annually the activities of our organization – activities both broad and specific. Your generous support is vital to our operations, and we pride ourselves in setting the highest standards for this work, as evidenced by our accreditation by the Land Trust Alliance.

The work of the Sheriff's Meadow staff is invaluable. A typical day for our rangers and stewards includes: managing and building trails; identifying rare species; mitigating the drastic impact of the southern pine beetle infestation; and overseeing the numerous conservation properties – the most recent additions include Squibnocket Pond Reservation and Mumcheag Creek Preserve.

Woodland, wildlife, ocean, and pond activities all highlight the work of Sheriff's Meadow, as we fulfill our mission of “conserving the natural, beautiful, rural landscape and character of Martha's Vineyard.”

Report of the President, *Adam Moore*

July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025

On June 21, 2024, the Board of Directors of Sheriff's Meadow Foundation met for its Annual Meeting at 78 Campbell Road in West Tisbury. This was the first meeting to be held at Sheriff's Meadow's new office and maintenance facility. Elected to first, three-year terms as Directors were Larry Band, Matt Flanders, Ellen Harley, Travis Lenkner, and Shipley Salewski. It should be noted that Ellen Harley was actually re-joining the Board, after being off the Board for a required hiatus of at least one year. Elected to second, three-year terms as Directors were Barbara Cole, Sevda Kleinman, Wanda Moreis, and Brien O'Brien. Sara Tucker was elected to a third, three-year term as a Director, and Alan Rappaport was elected to a fourth, one-year term as a Director. Adam Moore was elected to a one-year term as a Director.

At the same meeting, the Board elected Alan Rappaport to a one-year term as Chair, and elected Susannah Bristol to a one-year term as Chair-Elect and Vice Chair. Elected to one-year Officer terms were Peter Brooks as Treasurer, Alec Walsh as Clerk, and Adam Moore as President. The Board bade farewell to Directors Mary Lou DeLong, Geoffrey Lauprete, and Liz Packer.

The Annual Summer Benefit was held on July 15, 2024 at Stonewall Farm in West Tisbury, the home of Ellen and Ed Harley. Those gathered had the opportunity to enjoy the pastoral setting along Middle Road, and an intrepid few may have even walked the connecting trail that leads along the edge of the farm, across the Tiasquam, and up the hill

to Sheriff's Meadow's new office and maintenance facility. Following the reception, guests enjoyed a delicious dinner and heard remarks from Foundation leaders.

The southern pine beetle kept Sheriff's Meadow Foundation busy in pitch pine forests throughout much of the year. In the fall of 2024, Sheriff's Meadow completed its sanitation cutting at the Phillips Preserve and used an air curtain burner to dispose of the "slash." This operation lasted two months and marked the first-ever permitted use of an air curtain burner in Massachusetts. The burner reduced the wildfire hazard, safely disposed of the tops of trees and unusable, crooked logs, and produced biochar as a byproduct.

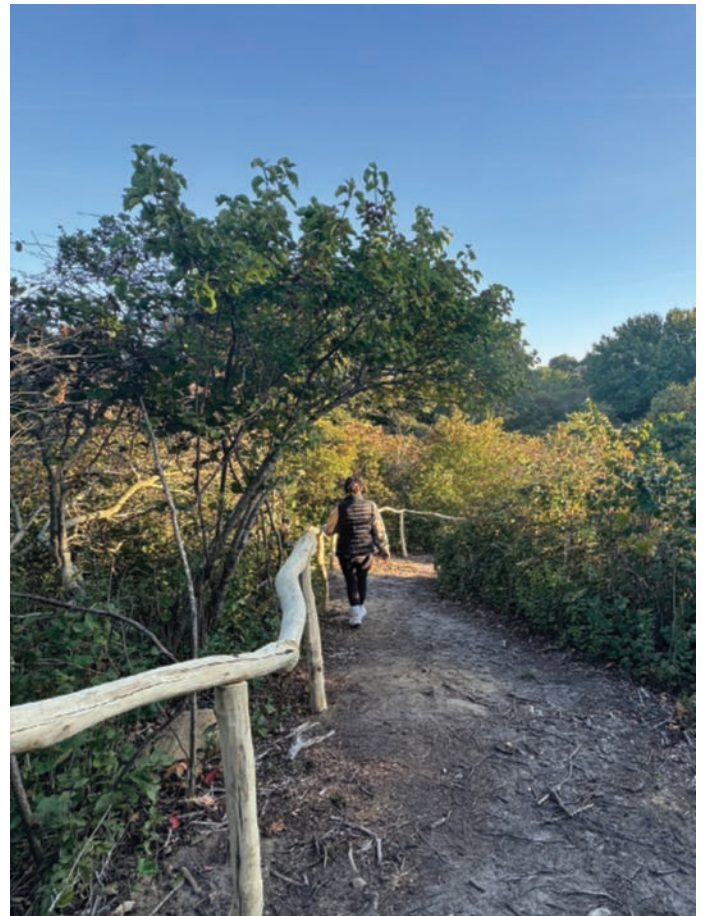
In the spring of 2025, Sheriff's Meadow conducted two other significant forestry operations. At the Caroline Tuthill Preserve, the Foundation thinned 15 acres of the pine forest here. This thinning was conducted to reduce the wildfire hazard and also to give the remaining trees a better chance at surviving a future beetle outbreak. Of note is that this work was performed with a new skid steer and other forest harvesting equipment that Sheriff's Meadow had purchased.

Using the Foundation's own equipment and conducting the work with its own, licensed staff significantly lowers the cost. At West Chop Woods, the Foundation dealt with the aftermath of an ongoing beetle outbreak. The property was closed to the public, scores of dead trees beside the trails and near neighboring houses were cut, and then the property was reopened.

Sheriff's Meadow Foundation enjoyed a banner year for land conservation in Fiscal Year 2025. On December 20, 2024, the Foundation received a gift of a Stonewall Pond beach lot from Neil and Donna Weisman. On January 27, 2025, the estate of Robert Lyman donated two small properties on Chappaquiddick, one on Litchfield Road, and the other on West Cape Poge Avenue, near Sampson's Hill. On February 21, 2025, Barry and Grace Reeves of Aquinnah donated two lots on Old Field Road in Aquinnah. And on December 30, 2024, Sheriff's Meadow Foundation purchased 83 acres of Pimpneymouse Farm on Chappaquiddick from the Potter and Slater families. On the same day, the Martha's Vineyard Land Bank Commission purchased an abutting 87 acres of Pimpneymouse Farm. The land purchased by Sheriff's Meadow Foundation has now been opened to the public as Mumcheag Creek Preserve, while the Land Bank purchase was added to the existing, abutting Poucha Pond Reservation.

In June of 2025, Sheriff's Meadow Foundation and the Martha's Vineyard Land Bank Commission quietly opened for public use Squibnocket Pond Reservation in Aquinnah. This land actually consists of two separate properties: Squibnocket Pond Reservation North and Squibnocket Pond Reservation South. Each property has its own trailhead and trail system, and each property requires an advance registration to reserve a parking space. On June 7, 2024, Sheriff's Meadow Foundation was honored to dedicate the *Ron Rappaport Trail* at Squibnocket Pond Reservation South to the late and greatly esteemed island attorney, Ronald H. Rappaport.

As the fiscal year drew to a close, Sheriff's Meadow once again held its Annual Meeting. This year, the meeting was held on June 27, 2025 at 78 Campbell Road in West Tisbury. At this meeting, the Board elected new Directors Peter Getsinger, Megan Greenglass, Terry Guylay,

Benjamin Martin, and Jonathan Steinberg. In this group, both Peter Getsinger and Terry Guylay returned to the Board, having served the required hiatus of at least one year. The Board elected Jesse Ausubel, Robin Rivera, and Samme Thompson to second, three-year terms on the Board, and elected Matthew Dix, Tom Enders, Tom Rapone, and Amy Weinberg to third, three-year terms as Directors.

At this meeting, the Board also elected Officers. Susannah Bristol was elected to a one-year term as Chair. Peter Brooks was elected to a one-year Term as Treasurer, Alec Walsh was elected to a one-year term as Clerk, and Adam Moore was elected to a one-year term as President. The Board bade farewell to departing Directors Stever Aubrey, Lisa Foster, Hillary Noyes-Keene, Alan Rappaport, and John Schaefer.

Report of the Treasurer, *Peter Brooks*

During the 2024-2025 fiscal year (July 1 to June 30), Sheriff's Meadow Foundation enjoyed another strong year financially. As in years past, this success is in no small part to the remarkable generosity of the community of supporters of the Foundation.

Our mission is to safeguard the scenic charm and rustic heritage of Martha's Vineyard for the benefit of both today's community and those to come. Throughout 2025—as highlighted in this Annual Report—the Foundation made significant strides in advancing this vision. By maintaining an extensive network of trails and overlooks, we have introduced an increasing number of people to our diverse landscapes. This engagement has resonated with our donor base; the generous backing of long-time advocates and fresh supporters alike has bolstered our financial health. Consequently, Sheriff's Meadow is exceptionally well-prepared to uphold and broaden its conservation efforts in the future.

The completed audited financial statements, as prepared by Plante & Moran, PLLC, are available on request and are posted on our website. The paragraphs below offer a summary of financial highlights for the year.

Balance Sheet

Turning first to the Balance Sheet, Sheriff's Meadow ended fiscal 2025 with \$107.3 million in total net assets versus the end of fiscal 2024 total of \$100.3 million. Much of this increase in total assets is attributable to the increase in the value of our land holdings, increasing from \$79.6 million at the end of fiscal 2024 to \$87.1 million in June, 2025. Our balance sheet reflects the market value of our land holdings as of the time of acquisition, but in many instances these values have increased substantially over time.

During the fiscal year, the value of the Foundation's invested assets declined slightly, from \$16.5 million at the end of June, 2024 to \$15.9 million at the end of June, 2025. While the Foundation's endowment assets enjoyed a return during the period roughly equivalent to market returns, designated funds in the Foundation's invested assets as of the end of June, 2024 were used to complete the scheduled purchase of Pimpneymouse Farm on Chappaquiddick.

Sheriff's Meadow remains committed to managing our endowment to provide a long-term source of financial strength and flexibility

for our operations. With the careful oversight of our Finance Committee, we continue to rely on the advisory services of Brown Advisory to oversee the investment of our endowment accounts. Our investment policy continues to exclude fossil fuel companies in the portfolio.

Cash and cash equivalents ended the year at \$0.2 million, down from \$0.5 million at the end of fiscal 2024, reflecting the use of cash for equipment purchases, expenses associated with the completion of our new headquarters at Campbell Road, and costs associated with efforts to mitigate the effects of the pine beetle infestation across the Island.

Liabilities as of the end of fiscal 2025 were higher than at the end of the prior year: \$2.9 million versus \$1.2 million. The major contributor to this increase in liabilities is a Note Payable associated with the Pimpneymouse Farm acquisition.

Revenues and Expenses

On the operating side, total revenues were \$8.2 million for fiscal 2025, an increase of \$2.4 million from the 2024 total of \$5.8 million. This increase is primarily a reflection of an increase of \$1.8 million for the year in donations of land and conservation restrictions. As has been the case in previous years, the Summer Benefit and the Annual Fund comprise the most significant sources of revenue for the organization's annual operating budget.

It is important to note that, to support our program activities, the Foundation withdraws approximately 4.5% of certain available investment balances consistent with current endowment distribution policy. At least annually, the Finance Committee reviews the distribution policy as well as the various endowment funds to meet the cash needs of Sheriff's Meadow.

Expenses for the year totaled \$3.0 million, slightly higher than 2024's expenses of \$2.5 million, reflecting the increasing costs of stewardship of the growing portfolio of Foundation properties.

On this note, we should acknowledge that the careful observer will note that the Foundation's operating expenses have grown significantly in recent years, (\$3.0 million in Fiscal 2025 versus \$1.2 million in Fiscal 2017), a growth in expenses that might on the surface appear to be concerning. Yet, this increase in operating expenses is a reflection of the increases in staffing and related property management expenses the Foundation is now able to direct to expanded acres of conservation requiring active maintenance. None of this expansion in scope would be possible without the increasing levels of community support the Foundation enjoys.

Conclusion

In sum, fiscal 2025 was a year experiencing continued growth in resources, positive operating results, expansion in the Foundation's conserved land holdings, and a balance sheet that positions Sheriff's Meadow Foundation for continued success in realizing its mission "to conserve the natural, beautiful, rural landscape and character of Martha's Vineyard."
